

Law and Society Schubert Award

The “Glendon Schubert and James Neal Schubert Award” is given annually to support **graduate students** engaged in law and society research. The award sponsors one student to attend the **Law and Society Association’s Annual Meeting** (www.lawandsociety.org)

To apply, please submit an abstract (max 500 words) of a paper you hope to present at the conference. Papers are encouraged from a broad variety of themes, both traditional socio-legal topics (such as courts and litigation, legal education, health, legal pluralism) as well as broader topics (such as indigenous peoples, finance and economy, war and human security, immigration, counter-terrorism, transnational regulation, globalization.) The Schubert Award will cover airfare, accommodations for 3-4 nights, and the conference registration fee.

Your application must also include a CV or Resume and a cover letter that briefly spells out your academic trajectory at UHM and the role that your proposed paper plays in your research agenda. **Application deadline is October 1 of every year.** The LSA conference is held in late May/early June of the following year.

Qualification of eligibility

1. Recipients must be full-time or part-time graduate students enrolled in the UHM Department of Political Science.
2. Academic merit demonstrated by a minimum cumulative GPA 3.5 or above.
3. Preference shall be given to students studying public law, law and society or biopolitics.
4. Successful applicants will submit their paper abstracts to the LSA the conference deadline and present their paper at the conference.
