The "Glendon Schubert and James Neal Schubert Award" is given annually to support **graduate students** engaged in law and society research. The award sponsors one student to attend the **Law and Society Association's Annual Meeting** (www.lawandsociety.org)

To apply, please submit an abstract (max 500 words) of a paper you hope to present at the conference. Papers are encouraged from a broad variety of themes, both traditional socio-legal topics (such as courts and litigation, legal education, health, legal pluralism) as well as broader topics (such as indigenous peoples, finance and economy, war and human security, immigration, counter-terrorism, transnational regulation, globalization.) The Schubert Award will cover airfare, accommodations for 3-4 nights, and the conference registration fee.

Your application must also include a CV or Resume and a cover letter that briefly spells out your academic trajectory at UHM and the role that your proposed paper plays in your research agenda. **Application deadline is October 1 of every year.** The LSA conference is held in late May/early June of the following year.

Qualification of eligibility

- 1. Recipients must be full-time or part-time graduate students enrolled in the UHM Department of Political Science.
- 2. Academic merit demonstrated by a minimum cumulative GPA 3.5 or above.
- 3. Preference shall be given to students studying public law, law and society or biopolitics.
- 4. Successful applicants will submit their paper abstracts to the LSA the conference deadline and present their paper at the conference.
